### **Arvid Nordquist's new coffee roastery in Järfälla is now in operation**

In 1961, the Swedish family company, Arvid Nordquist, opened the doors to their first coffee roastery. In 2025, more than 60 years later, the company took the next step in its development by establishing a new state-of-the-art coffee roastery in Järfälla, outside Stockholm.

The new coffee roastery was inaugurated in May 2025 following months of testing and fine-tuning to ensure the highest quality at every stage. During 2025, the processes were further refined, and since December 2025 the roastery has been in full operation.

It is one of the company's largest investments to date and it puts taste, quality and sustainability at the centre.

### **The coffee roastery of the future**

The new roastery is not only larger and more advanced; it is also Sweden's first coffee roastery to be built mainly in wood — and one of the few in the world to be so. The frame for the 24-meter-high roasting hall and production facility is 70% wood, while the offices are 90% wood. Using wood offers significant climate savings. The building carries the Silver certification under the Swedish Environmental Building standard. To qualify, the roastery must meet the strict requirements set for energy efficiency and environmental performance.

The roasters are powered by 100% biogas, which significantly reduces the climate impact compared to fossil fuels. Through smart energy recovery and digitalized processes, the roastery is both efficient and future-proof – without compromising Arvid Nordquist's well-known commitment to quality and taste.

Advanced control systems make it possible to fine-tune the roasting process to the smallest detail which helps maintain quality and minimises resource consumption. Full traceability from green coffee to finished product provides both transparency and security throughout the chain.

### **Taste, quality and sustainability at the centre**

Arvid Nordquist has long been a pioneer in sustainability and quality in the coffee industry. With the new roastery in Järfälla, the company is taking the next step and showing that it is possible to combine tradition, craftsmanship and innovation while taking responsibility for people and for the environment.

“The transition to production in Järfälla is an important milestone for us. It is not just about starting up a new roastery and production line – it is about ensuring that the high quality and taste that our customers appreciate and expect continue to be delivered”, says Wilhelm Nordquist, CEO at Arvid Nordquist.
